Title	Behavioral Health Payment Reform – Updates for Phases 2, 3, and 4		

This memo is intended to provide an update about **Phases 2, 3 and 4 of Behavioral Health (BH) Payment Reform** implementation to Behavioral Health Services (BHS) contractors that provide Medi-Cal eligible services.

### **Update: Phase 2 Rate Implementation**

Phase 2 rate implementation will shift to April 1, 2024, impacting:

- Mental Health Residential Services
- Mental Health Crisis Residential Services

### **Update: Phase 3 Rate Implementation**

Rates for the Crisis Stabilization Units CSUs will shift to April 1, 2024.

## **Update: Phase 4 Rate Implementation**

• Rates for Substance Use Disorder Outpatient Services have been developed and are scheduled for implementation on July 1, 2024.

#### **Update: Phases 5 and 6 Rate Implementation**

Rates are still being developed for Phases 5 and 6.

- Phase 5: Mental Health Outpatient Services will be implemented on July 1, 2024.
- Phase 6: Mobile Crisis Teams will be implemented on July 1, 2024.

NOTE: It remains <u>essential for providers to ramp up billing between now and July 1, 2024</u>, to support viability under the new payment reform FFS payment structure.

Communication around future FFS rate implementation will be communicated to contractors via memos.

Phase 5	Mental Health Outpatient Services	July 1, 2024*	Rates under development

#### **Rate Adjustments**

FFS rates in the initial year of payment reform were developed based on actual utilization and billing by contracted programs to preserve continuity of care without any significant financial impact to contracted providers during the transition; therefore, several service categories will receive rates that are higher in the initial year.

As the system matures and contracted providers optimize services and significantly increase billable units of service provided, rates will be adjusted to align with the maximum State rates and billing expectations.

#### FFS Rates in New Requests for Proposals (RFPs)

Rates established for new RFPs will be adjusted to align with new billing expectations for services, and therefore may not align with rates established during the initial FFS transition. Rates included within new RFPs will be modified or adjusted annually to align with adjustments to rates set by the State.
