TIP SHEET: Contingency Management Incentive Program



Contingency Management (CM) is an incentive-based pilot program designed for Medi-Cal eligible clients with a moderate or severe stimulant use disorder (StimUD) diagnosis (dx). The pilot consists of a structured 24-week outpatient CM program, followed by Recovery Services.

Client must be admitted and remain in an outpatient SUD Treatment program while receiving Contingency Management services. Client must be offered outpatient services. As with CalOMS admissions, a beneficiary will be considered a readmission if they leave CM services for more than 30 days.

Instructions

Existing Client actively receiving SUD Treatment – follow instructions 1-2 for diagnosis and encounters.

New Client being admitted, follow normal admission process then instructions 1-2 below.

- 1. Diagnosis List
 - Enter appropriate StimUD dx (if one exists, disregard this step)
 - Enter the two following dx (later to be selected from the <u>Diagnoses for this Service</u> section of the encounter)
 - Z71.51 Drug abuse counseling and surveillance of drug abuser (use for negative urine test for stimulants)

 \circ R82.998 Other abnormal findings in urine (use for positive urine test for stimulants)

 <u>NOTE</u>: On Diagnosis List, when entering Z71.51 or R82.998 dx, do not enter in secondary or tertiary fields

2. Encounters/Services –

- Complete encounter
 - Service field = Select <u>Contingency Mgmt</u>



- Billable field = YES
- Contact Type field = Face to Face (must be face to face service for drug testing)
- Visit Type field = Contingency Mgmt
- Medi-Cal Billable field = YES
- Diagnosis for this Service field = Primary SUD dx will populate this section
 - If the primary SUD dx is not a StimUD dx, user must click the drop down and change dx to StimUD
 - Click on the <u>Secondary</u> field and select the appropriate dx that reflects the urine test results for the specific visit
 - Z71.51 Drug abuse counseling and surveillance of drug abuser (use for negative urine test for stimulants)
 - R82.998 Other abnormal findings in urine (use for positive urine test for stimulants)
- o Save and click <u>Release to Billing</u> under Administrative Actions

IMPORTANT:

- StimUD dx MUST be on the encounter for Contingency Management Service
- Only one drug test result dx MUST be on the encounter for Contingency Management Service-
