

BHS EHR Projects



Background

EHR Upgrades and Implementations

- Behavioral Health Services (BHS) has been working on an upgrade to SanWITS for the SUD System of Care (SOC).
- BHS has also been working on a replacement for Cerner Community
 Behavioral Health (CCBH), the Mental Health SOC EHR.
 - In November 2023, BHS announced that SmartCare, a new semistatewide EHR offered through CalMHSA, was selected as the replacement for CCBH.



Background

SmartCare for California behavioral health systems

- SmartCare was designed specifically for California behavioral health systems and meets all state reporting and billing requirements.
- It meets 42 CFR Part 2 privacy requirements and includes a robust consent management tool.
- For the SUD SOC, SmartCare provides more efficient and streamlined workflows that satisfy CalAIM requirements.





Shift in Strategy

New Strategy: SmartCare

For the SUD System of Care:

BHS is halting the SanWITS upgrade and pivoting to the implementation of SmartCare.



SmartCare

Why did BHS select SmartCare?

SmartCare is designed specifically for CA behavioral health services systems.

Currently, 25+ Counties in California have or are implementing SmartCare, representing more than 37% of the state Medi-Cal population.



SmartCare

Why did BHS select SmartCare?

SmartCare was selected because it:

- Is customized to meet CalAIM, CalOMS, and other state requirements;
- Provides more streamlined documentation and reporting;
- Was specifically created to capture data across multiple levels
- of behavioral health care; and
- Provides a user-friendly interface that supports **more personcentered care**.

CDAGs and Interoperability



Data Sharing and Increased Visibility

Clinical Data Access Groups (CDAGs) will be set up within SmartCare to determine which programs information you are able to see based on roles

Clients can consent to sharing treatment information via a SmartCare consent form

SUD providers may be able to see other SUD providers documentation

SUD providers may be able to see Mental Health providers documentation

Mental Health providers may be able to see SUD providers documentation



Interoperability

Currently, the interoperability functionality is being explored with SmartCare

SmartCare aligns with DHCS & Federal regulations, therefore interoperability IS on the roadmap, however, it will not be available at Go Live.

SOC Impacts

How does this impact the SOC?

All EHR users will require training prior to go-live. Training plans will be developed as project plans are confirmed.

All sites will need to prepare for go-live. Downtime procedures will be required. The SUDOPOH will be updated for downtime procedures.

Entry requirements into SmartCare will be similar to SanWITS for most providers. However, if you are currently on paper, the intent is for SmartCare to become your EHR as of September 1, 2024.

At this time, SUD SOC leadership should maintain awareness about the project status and begin communicating with staff.



Subject Matter Experts (SMEs)

SUD SMEs are needed to support implementation

- Super Users are SMEs who will support SmartCare Implementation:
 - Review SmartCare functionality and understand workflows
 - Conduct testing & receive early training
 - Assist during go live (troubleshoot and communicate issues)
- **Deep dive SMEs** will participate in a more in-depth review of SmartCare, with a focus on specific areas of functionality and/or user roles


